

Pickering GO station now has 1,200 more parking spaces

Project funded by federal, provincial governments

PICKERING -- A new parking structure is now open at the Pickering GO train station, adding 1,200 new parking spots.

That brings the total number of spaces at that station to 3,600.

There is access to the pedestrian bridge across Hwy. 401 from the new parking area, as well as a covered walkway to the station building.

The parking expansion project comes with a price tag of \$47 million, with the federal and provincial governments kicking in \$18.25 million each.

The Ontario government is contributing the remaining amount through Metrolinx.

The structure includes 33 accessible parking spaces on the ground level and will feature two future electric vehicle charging units.
